Three sisters, Elsie, Isabel, and Jennie, ages 5 to 7-years old, are currently waiting for openings at Mooseheart.

The responsibility of raising them has fallen to their eldest sister due to their single mother's inability to provide for them. Their single mother of five daughters has an undiagnosed mental illness due to multiple traumatic occurrences from her life in her home country. When their mother was young and pregnant with Elsie, her third daughter, she fled her war-torn land with her two eldest daughters. The mother and the girls lived in unstable conditions, moving frequently for many years. She eventually found shelter in Chicagoland.

The girls, whose age range is 5 through 7-years old, desperately need stability and care.

When the family felt settled, they connected with a church and its congregation. Many of the church members became lifelong friends of the family, helping them navigate the new city. Once the mother met a man named Mike, their lives changed forever. He was a heavy drinker who became very malicious and abusive when he drank. Despite this, they had two girls together, Isabel and Jennie. The mother and father constantly bickered, fueled by both parents alcohol abuse. Eventually, friends of the family helped the mother get a restraining order against the father.

**"I would be happy to go to Mooseheart.
I am nice and have a lot of potential."**

In her application to Mooseheart, one of the girls shares,
"I've had a hard childhood. I didn't have companionship or stability. When I came home from school, no one would be home. I would be late for school. I want to go to Mooseheart because it will be stable. I'll make more friends and have a better education."

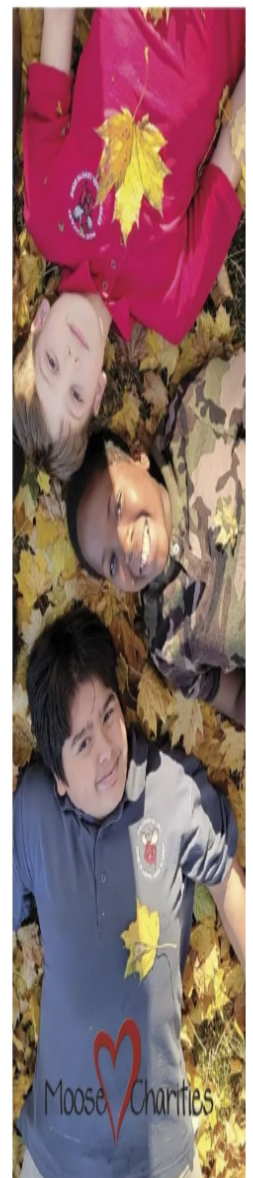

Katherine Smith Memory Support Hall Is Celebrating 10 Years!

Moosehaven's Katherine Smith Memory Support Hall celebrated its 10-year anniversary on February 16 with an Open House that many enjoyed. Residents of the hall opened their doors to staff to visit and see why their home is one of the most beautiful on campus!

The hall was opened on February 16, 2013 and has since provided a wonderful home to many residents who experience age-related dementia. The \$2 million in funding to build the Katherine Smith Hall was raised by Women of the Moose. They proved their commitment to serving Moosehaven as they reached that goal in less than two years.

Katherine Smith Hall caters to active, physically-able residents who can participate in and benefit from the activities and engagement offered by the staff. Residents are an integral part of their own daily activities. They help set the table for meals, assist with their own laundry, work in the garden and more.

The program utilized at Katherine Smith Hall is called the Universal Worker Program. This program uses the same staff in the hall and that staff does not rotate to other areas of campus healthcare. With this program, residents get used to the staff and consider them part of their family. Staff not only provides assistance with resident needs as nurses and Certified Nursing Assistants, they perform duties like laundry, cooking and cleaning as part of the Universal Worker Program. This program does much to make Katherine Smith Hall a true home for our residents and keeps them engaged in creating a home for themselves. ■



Florida Hall Converts to Brandon Place Apartments

Construction on the first villas for the New Life Brandon Place Admissions Program started in 2008 and the first residents moved to their new home in 2010. And it has grown by leaps and bounds since!

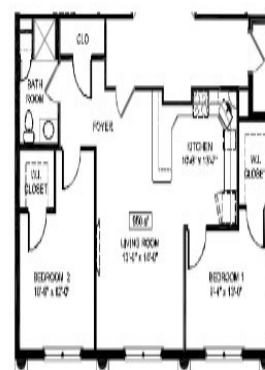
Today, Brandon Place includes 42 villa homes, 20 apartments at St Johns Apartments and 11 apartments at Buckeye Hall. All but two apartments are currently filled and a total of 90 residents live at Brandon Place.

It has become clear that Brandon Place needs to expand, and Moosehaven recently began a project to convert the existing Florida Hall into 13 apartments. These one- and two-bedroom apartments, estimated to be completed by late July, will be used for the New Life Brandon Place Program.

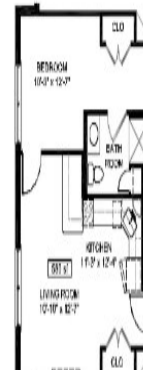
The New Life Brandon Place Program offers fully independent living in well-appointed apartments and villa homes. Residents pay a one-time entrance fee based on the floor plan and location of their chosen home and then an ongoing monthly fee which covers the services they receive. Residents maintain their own personal financial portfolio and expenses. Financial qualifications are required for admission to Brandon Place at Moosehaven.

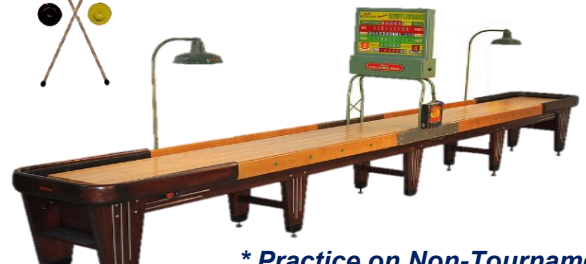

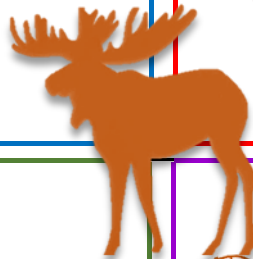
