New Campaign Off To A Great Start!

It's an exciting time to be a Moose, and our growth is proof that we are providing value to our members and community.

Traditionally, this is the time of year when our membership numbers are lacking. However, we've hit the ground running and our numbers so far in the "Proud Past, Bright Future" campaign are up from last year. It's a great start!

Our membership production for May and June is up by 1,375 applications compared to last year and overall membership is up by nearly 5,000 as of the end of June.

We need to always pay attention to our retention efforts. As of mid-July, we had 150,179 expired members and 147,647 dropped memberships. Just think, we could be over 1 million strong in The Moose if we could recover these members! It's an exciting time to be a Moose, and our growth is proof that we are providing value to our members and community.

At the International Convention in Reno, I made a special point about our retention efforts. This is one of the key reasons we exceeded our goals. We always talk about retention, and we had a retention rate of 88% a year ago. That's great, but with some work, we can do even better this year.

Our 5 Club goal a year ago was to raise money to buy a high-definition television for the Moosehaven auditorium. Not only did we raise the money needed, the \$35,000 we raised exceeded the goal by \$10,000. This year, the 5 Club project is to provide funds for sporting equipment to be used at Moosehaven's forthcoming AAA project.



Finally, this is a story I shared in Reno, from an interview I saw with singer-songwriter Amy Grant. I recalled a conversation she had with a World War II veteran. The veteran said there are five phrases that encourage a community feeling.

1. How can I help you?
2. I'm proud of you!
3. I love you!
4. Thank you!
5. We!

I'd like all Moose to remember these throughout 2023-24 and beyond. ■




