# Free Dues Program To End Soon

Invoices will begin arriving soon for sisters whose dues in the Women of the Moose expire April 30, 2024. Dues can be paid online via credit or debit card or by mailing a check with the coupon. Dues can also be paid with your Moose Rewards points at no cost to you.

Your annual chapter dues help provide the best possible life experiences for the children and senior members in our care. Chapters provide funding for Mooseheart athletic programs and music department as well as Moosehaven's beauty and barber shop, pharmacy assistance, special events and holiday celebrations, and other everyday needs of our beloved residents.

Additionally, dues renewals generate \$1.4M ANNUALLY, designated for the Mooseheart school. A portion of your dues also helps your chapter meet its philanthropic endeavors locally and nationally. If our sisters don't renew their dues, where will this money come from?

Donations to the Scholarship and Maintenance Fund provide educational opportunities for Mooseheart graduates. The WOTM have donated almost \$2M to this fund in the last five years. In the last two years, all Mooseheart graduates qualified for scholarship money.

Not all chapter members are active chapter participants. Chapter membership was their only way of obtaining the privileges of membership. You can encourage them to participate in chapter activities and provide a deeper level of service.

As you have heard before, the mission and purpose of the Women of the Moose has not changed. Our focus remains on Mooseheart, Moosehaven and our communities, but the Women of the Moose are so much more. We are all about Mooseheart and Moosehaven, but chapter members can be part of something bigger – a Women of the Moose that empowers women while inspiring them in friendship, fellowship and fun!


